


## PLANS TO SERVE MORE

Although we did not build any new homes this last year, our goal to serve more adults with IDD remained at the forefront. In 2022, we purchased the lot for our 8th home, and we added another bedroom to one of our existing homes, opening space for another Core Member. We will break ground on the 8th home Spring of 2023. To add to that, plans to reopen Day Hab were finalized at the end of 2022, and Day Hab officially reopened in early 2023.

#### OUR CORE MEMBERS

In 2022, we served 18 individuals through our hourly SCL program, 31 through our 24-hour SCL program, and 4 through our transitional SCL program. Additionally, we provided representative payee services to 22 individuals, assisting them with money management.

#### RAISING AWARENESS

Friendship Ark was one of the featured non-profit organizations at Ames on the Half Shell in 2022. At this event, we were able to share our mission and more about the services our Core Members need. Further, we restarted our Advocacy & Accessibility Committee this last year. Members of this committee attended a public feedback session held by the Ames Park and Recreation Department to share insight on the accessibility needs of our Core Members at city parks. These are just a few examples of how we continue to help our Core Members successfully be a part of their community.

Last year, our 24-hour SCL Core Members averaged 80% success with these goals, while Hourly SCL averaged 76% success and Transitional SCL averaged 61% success.
