The Impact of Employment Opportunities for People Living with Intellectual and Developmental Disabilities (IDD)

For people living with disabilities, employment means greater economic self-sufficiency, an opportunity to use their skills, and more active participation in community life. They are productive, loyal employees when they have employment opportunities suited to their capabilities and interests. Employing people with disabilities has been shown to benefit businesses, for example, as a result of lower turnover, increased productivity, and access to a broader pool of skilled workers. To provide you with a glimpse into what it is like to employ people living with IDD, we asked Joel, a manager at Texas Roadhouse in Ames, to answer a few questions about his experience employing people with IDD for us. While there are a number of employers in Ames offering job opportunities to the core members, Texas Roadhouse has stood out as an employer with an exceptionally positive spirit toward making the experience a positive one for everyone involved and working through any challenges that may arise. Texas Roadhouse currently employs five individuals living with IDD. Here are Joel's answers:

What would be your message to other businesses who don't employ adults with intellectual disabilities? Can you tell us about the benefits you see for Texas Roadhouse?

You're missing out on a great, simple opportunity to give back to the community. Our employees from Friendship Ark are some of the most reliable employees we have. The joy many of them have while working is a wonderful, constant reminder that we should all be happy at our jobs.

You have graciously worked through barriers while employing adults with disabilities, we appreciate your support through this and your willingness to help our core members develop into exceptional employees. Iowa is an at-will employment state, yet you take the time to work through these barriers, why is that?

Honestly, there aren't many barriers to work through. The support we get from job coaches and house staff makes it very easy to correct actions or change work performance. It might take a little extra time and patience on the shift, but it's another reminder that we should treat all employees with a little extra time and patience.

What is something we can do as an organization to support Texas Roadhouse in employing people with intellectual disabilities?

I don't think anything is necessary. We're happy to be a part of the community!

What is something that has surprised you or that you have learned by employing individuals living with disabilities?

I love the daily reminders that we should be happy, love our jobs, and live every day to the max! And I've definitely become a better manager with all staff members due to my management of staff with intellectual disabilities.

Having a job gives the core members who are able to work purpose, and they are each very proud of what they do. We visited with Shane and Ben to find out what having a job at Texas Roadhouse means to them.

Shane shared that he has been employed at Texas Roadhouse as a Lead Service Assistant for 5 years and "loves his job". His position sometimes allows him to train other staff. As a part of his duties, he clears tables, runs food, mops the floors and performs various other tasks as he is always willing to help. You may also find him dressing up as the Armadillo during events. Shane feels his managers "understand his disability and advocate for him; they don't tolerate bullying". Shane states that he was bullied a lot in school, so it is important to him that he doesn't have to deal with that at work. Having a job has helped create opportunities to socialize with others and work through emotions when working on a team. Shane feels his team understands his ADHD. Shane was awarded Roadie of the Month in June of 2021.

Ben also works at Texas Roadhouse and shared that he "loves his job" and that his co-workers and the customers are very nice. Ben looks forward to seeing his co-workers each week and was sure to mention that the food is really good as well. Ben's job is loading the dishwasher and busing tables. He likes that his managers have helped him learn new tasks and are helping him to stay focused at work. Ben shared that his manager, Joel, makes him smile and that it is his favorite when Joel tells him he is WWE Intercontinental Champion. If you know Ben at all, wrestling is one of his passions.




Springtime Adventures
