We continue to attend Ames Rotary, 1 Million Cups, and Leadership Ames events and had the opportunity to be a guest speaker on KASI's Mel in the Morning show to promote Friendship Ark and our Gala. Additionally, we were invited to be the guest speaker for the United Way DEI group to present about how we can promote an inclusive environment for adults living with intellectual disabilities, and our Executive Director, Jennifer, and House Supervisor, Delaney, spoke to a group of nursing students about who we are at Friendship Ark and the importance of their role as nurses to what we do. We are extremely thankful for several members of the lowa State University Campus Service Council who helped us paint the Westfield house's hallway as a service project this spring.

One thing we are very proud of is how we provide our core members with opportunities to be active in the community. We have a Day Habilitation Program without walls which means we try to find activities you and I enjoy and make them accessible to the core members. Our community involvement activities vary and include music, art, and culture such as attending the Music Man Junior Play at the Community Theatre in Altoona, IA, attending concerts such as the Eli Young Band at the Val Air Ballroom and a Tribute to the Allman Brothers at the Camelot Theater in Nevada, IA, as well as the Bohemian Arts Festival at Merle Hay Mall and the Ames Renaissance Faire. Spiritual offerings for the core members have included a six-week series of The Chosen through Lutheran Church of Hope in Ames, and attending the special needs ministry at Lutheran Church of Hope in West Des Moines called One Body. We are loving the connections we are making with peers from the Des Moines metro area as a result of our involvement. Other community events we have attended include the Cyclone Stampede Rodeo at Iowa State, one of our core members participating in two different book clubs at Dog-Eared Books on Main Street in Ames, and a group that has been going to BINGO in Ankeny regularly. Another way we like to engage with our community is by volunteering our time and talents. We regularly man the water table for the Runners United Nevada Running Club which offers a series of six runs throughout the year, we planted flowers at Daley Park in Ames through the City of Ames, and delivered flyers and collected food items door-to-door to help fill the pantries through the United Way of Story County Food Drive.

Intermediate Service Option Leads to Success

Friendship Ark's first ever intermediate services house, the Fletcher House, opened in the fall of 2021 and was a milestone in the services we provide. Acting as a midway point between 24-hour in-person supervision and hourly Supported Community Living services, we have been able to closely support those who are ready for the next step towards independence. As featured in our year-end appeal mailing in the year of its opening, this project gave a group of core members, "A Chance to Fly", transitioning from 24/7 supervision to living together in a home with intermittent staff assistance. This summer, we are celebrating with two of the core members from the Fletcher House as they spread their wings and become roommates in an apartment they will be renting together, giving them even more independence with just the right amount of staff support from our hourly Supported Community Living Program to set them on a path to success. We are excited that the services provided at the Fletcher House have

Gentle Teaching—An Area of Continued Focus at Friendship Ark

"Companionship is a sense of connectedness. Connectedness to others is the center of the human condition." - Dr. John McGee

Companionship is one of the foundations of Gentle Teaching. It stresses the importance of creating meaningful, human connections between our staff and the core members we serve. The unconditional acceptance and gentle presence of this relationship establishes trust and promotes mutual learning and growing together. We experienced mutual learning and growing together when we brought staff together to train on Gentle Teaching earlier this year. Staff were able to hear about how they can utilize the techniques of Gentle Teaching in the way they interact with both core members and others in their lives. There were a variety of activities to engage participants in, and of course we had to have pizza and treats for our three hours of learning. In addition to being trained in Gentle Teaching, we also look to our peers for examples of what Gentle Teaching should look like. An excellent example of companionship can be found between Direct Support Professional, Marisa, and core member, Bill. Below, Marisa describes how she used the tools (hands, eyes, presence, words) and pillars (safe, loved, loving, engaged) of Gentle Teaching to foster this relationship.

Marisa and Bill's Story

"Bill and I met in 2021 when I began working at his home regularly. I typically work on the same day at the same time each week, which helps us establish and maintain trust and rapport. Over time, we built a beautiful friendship rooted in acceptance, respect, and humor. We talk, laugh, help each other complete tasks, and play games together regularly. Most importantly, I take the time to listen to and observe Bill, offering support and encouragement along the way. This enables me to understand who Bill is beyond his disabilities; his interests, and his needs. I think the key to success in our friendship is the level of mutual and genuine acceptance we share. I don't want to change Bill, rather, I aim to continuously support and provide him with a safe space to learn and grow as an individual and as



a friend. Bill is hilarious, thoughtful, clever, curious, and extremely helpful! I love being a part of Bill's life and I am grateful he accepts me. Whether we are looking at cars, grocery shopping, going to lunch, cooking dinner, fixing things, playing Pacman or pool, riding a bike, or simply chatting at the kitchen table, we always find thoughtful ways to ensure the other feels seen, understood, and accepted."

We talked with site Supervisor, Lindsey, on what this relationship means to Bill and here is her response:

"I think Marisa has done a phenomenal job of meeting Bill where he's at. Bill is very private and protective of his bedroom and has trouble getting rid of items. This can be a very intrusive type of task for a person. I think the rapport she's built with him has led to much success with this goal. She has also sought out opportunities to take Bill into the community and knows what he would like. Recently, he was just sitting at the kitchen table waiting for Marisa when I mentioned she was coming in tonight."

When we asked Bill about his friend and staff Marisa, he shared that some of his favorite things to do with Marisa are to ride bikes and look at old cars and that a blue Camaro is a favorite for both of them.

As mentioned above, at Friendship Ark we strive to create an environment of interconnectedness, where we all support each other in growing and learning. Marisa and Bill's companionship is a testament of that objective, and we are so thankful for the bond that has been created between these two!

Each one of them has played a crucial role in the patience and understanding I have, the strength and perseverance I have learned, and how to enjoy life wherever you are. Being the youngest of three, my two older siblings cared for me and pushed me to be a better person. Seeing the amazing things they have done in their lives and the goals they have set for themselves has pushed me to thrive and to better myself. My parents have supported me through good days and bad days and shown me what unconditional love is and the dedication it takes to love someone.
